


WHAT IS

Spiritual Adultery?

AND HOW DOES IT AFFECT THE HOLY SPIRIT?

SPIRITUAL ADULTERY, THE GREATEST HINDRANCE As unfaithfulness in the bond of marriage is so serious that most marriages never survive such, and considering that the Holy Spirit, in essence, refers to unfaithfulness to Christ as "spiritual adultery," we should understand how serious this problem is. In fact, it is meant by the Holy Spirit for us to see the seriousness of such action.

The tragedy is that none of us quite understand that spiritual adultery is just as bad in the spiritual sense as physical adultery is in the natural sense. Irrespective, however, of what we say or think, the truth cannot be denied.

Paul tells us that we are married to Christ and, as such, we are to be faithful to Him, and exclusively, which means to place our faith and trust exclusively in Christ and the cross, and to keep it exclusively in Christ and the cross.

MARRIED TO CHRIST Paul deals with this, as well, in his second letter to the Corinthians: "Would to God you could bear with me a little in my folly: and indeed bear with me. (In effect, the apostle is saying, 'indulge me.') For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy (refers to the 'jealousy of God' [Ex. 20:5; 34:14; Nah. 1:2]): for I have espoused you to one husband (not jealous of the Corinthians' affection for himself, but of their affection for Christ), that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ. (They must not commit spiritual adultery, which refers to trusting in things other than Christ and the cross.)"

THE SIMPLICITY THAT IS IN CHRIST "But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty (the strategy of Satan), so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ. (The gospel of Christ is simple, but men complicate it by adding to the message.)

ANOTHER JESUS "For if he who comes preaching another Jesus (a Jesus who is not of

the cross), whom we have not preached (Paul's message was 'Jesus Christ and Him crucified'; anything else is 'another Jesus'), or if you receive another spirit (which is produced by preaching another Jesus), which you have not received (that's not what you received when we preached the true gospel to you), or another gospel, which you have not accepted (anything other than 'Jesus Christ and Him crucified' is 'another gospel'), you might well bear with him. (The apostle is telling the Corinthians they have, in fact, sinned because they tolerated these false apostles who had come in, bringing 'another gospel' which was something other than Christ and the cross)" (II Cor. 11:1-4).

In fact, the far greater majority of the modern church is proclaiming "another Jesus."

WHAT DOES ANOTHER JESUS ACTUALLY MEAN? "Another Jesus" means that they were

MEAN? "Another Jesus" means that they were proclaiming Jesus, but ignoring the cross. In fact, those interlopers were promoting the law of Moses, claiming that it must be kept alongside accepting Jesus. And, if the people did not accept the law of Moses, meaning that the men would be circumcised, etc., then they were not saved, or else they were not a complete Christian. Today, it's a little different.

It is not so much the law of Moses that's being promoted now, but rather something in the place of the cross.

The modern church, at least after a fashion, is preaching Jesus, but it is Jesus, the "good Man," or the "miracle worker," the "great example," or the "great teacher." All of this means that they are claiming that man can reach his potential if he will only change a few habits, etc., and, thereby, be more like Jesus. In fact, the modern church is ignoring the real problem of man, which is sin.

SIN We must ever understand that man is in trouble, and I mean terrible trouble, not so much for what he does, even though that is very important, but mostly for what he is.

When it comes to the believer, we must also admit that our real problem is sin, but this the modern church will not do. As stated, it claims that the real problem of the modern Christian is that he simply needs to change his habits and become a better person.

While all of us need to be better people, still, it's Jesus Christ the Savior from sin who can make us such, and only Jesus.

Let me say it again—the problem with the modern Christian is sin. The only cure for that problem and the only answer for that problem is that we place our faith in Christ exclusively, and what He did for us at the cross, understanding that the cross of Christ is the only answer for sin. When this is done—and, I might quickly add, maintained, meaning that our faith ever remain in Christ and the cross—then the Holy Spirit, who alone can bring about His fruit within our lives, will begin to do His work.

If the believer places his faith in anything else, and I mean anything else, such as the Lord's Supper, fasting, water baptism, good works, giving money to the work of the Lord, performing good deeds, his church, his religious denomination, etc., then such a Christian is, in fact, living in a state of spiritual adultery. While the other things mentioned are good things that every true believer will engage in, still, the object of faith must always be, without exception, and continue to be, the cross of Christ (Rom. 6:1-14; 8:1-2, 11; I Cor. 1:17-18, 23; 2:2; Gal. 5; 6:14; Eph. 2:13-18; Col. 2:14-15).

HOW SERIOUS IS THIS MATTER OF SPIRITUAL ADULTERY? I will answer that by asking another question—how serious is unfaithfulness as it regards marriage between a husband and wife?

If I remember correctly, it was in late winter of 1992. We were then having two prayer meetings a day, which continued for ten years, and something I continue to personally subscribe.

That particular morning, as four or five of us gathered for prayer, I began to petition the Lord for particular things in my own personal life, which I felt I needed. In a very short period of time, the Spirit of God covered me greatly.

The Lord took me away from my own personal needs, although they were many, to the condition of the church, and I speak of the church world as a whole. He took me to the first chapter of the great prophet Isaiah. I will quote both text and notes from The Expositor's Study Bible that which the Lord gave me as it regards the church.

He said: "Hear, O heavens, and give ear, O Earth: for the LORD has spoken, I have nourished and brought up children, and they have rebelled against Me. (In this verse, all nature is invoked to hear Jehovah make complaint of the ingratitude of His people. The invocation is cast in the same form which is so common in Deuteronomy [Deut. 4:26; 30:19; 31:28; 32:1]. To step out of the Song of Solomon into Isaiah is to pass from sunshine to shadow. The love that exults in the one laments in the other. Actually, Isaiah is not the one actually speaking here, but rather Jehovah. The prophet is only His mouthpiece.) The ox knows his owner, and the ass his master's crib: but Israel does not know, My people do not consider. (The meaning of this verse seems to be, 'My people do not consider Me, do not reflect on My relation to them as Lord and Master.')"

THEY ARE GONE AWAY BACKWARD "Ah sinful nation, a people laden with iniquity, a seed of evildoers, children who are corrupters: they have forsaken the LORD, they have provoked the Holy One of Israel unto anger, they are gone away backward. (According to Isaiah, holiness is the most essential element of God's Nature; hence, he would call Him 'the Holy One of Israel.' In their forsaking the Lord, Judah did not renounce His worship, but actually continued it; however, it was reduced to a mere formality. The people 'honored Him with their lips, while their hearts were far from Him' [Isa. 29:13].)"

I've heard from Christians who say, "People are not getting healed nowadays." Others feel that we are on the brink of experiencing another great healing revival. And still others believe that a wave of healing has already started. We believe what the Bible says about divine healing, that the redemptive work of Christ on the cross provides healing of the human body in answer to believing prayer.

With His Stripes We Are Healed

We are aware of the ongoing argument as to whether divine healing is in the atonement, even though Isaiah 53:5, says it plainly, "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." Since Isaiah 53 is the detailed account of the atonement, we must conclude that divine healing is, in fact, in the atonement.

So, yes, the Lord is healing people today. You might not know about it or see it, but that doesn't matter—it's happening. We have viewers constantly writing in their testimonies about how they received healings from cancers, from diseases, and from anxieties and depression. Some of these people we know personally. And some, who have been dramatically healed, work right alongside us at the ministry, like Dr. Jimmy DuPree, our Vice President of Institutional Compliance at Jimmy Swaggart Bible College. He recently shared with us how the Lord healed him, and I'd like to share what he had to say about his own healing, in his own words. >>

WHEN I WAS ELEVEN YEARS OLD, doctors told me that I would not live to be a teenager. I had an infection in my head that had already surrounded the outer membrane of my brain. Basically, it was like meningitis on the brain. The pain of it was terrible. I lived in pain. I only knew how to have pain. The doctors said that as soon as the infection worked itself through that membrane, I would die.

I had four operations. To reach the affected area, surgeons had to literally cut and lift my ears off and then go in and repair the mastoid bones, which are located just behind each ear. Next, I went to a specialist at Emory University in Atlanta. There, using long needles, he tried to drain as much of the infection from my head as he could. Afterward, the doctors said they had done all that they could do.

At that time, we were Baptists, so we didn't hear a lot about healing. But one day in her Bible reading, my mother found James 5:14-15. She went to our Baptist pastor and said, "It says here, 'Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick,

and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him."

Now this pastor loved my family, and he did not want to see me die, and I was dying. By this time, several doctors had delivered the same prognosis: I would be dead by the time I was a teenager. But I'm so thankful that our pastor was honest with us. After hearing my mother quote that passage from James, he looked at her and said, "Well, we've never really prayed that way here, but there is someone who has." That someone was Oral Roberts, and he was about to hold a tent meeting in Atlanta.

As Baptists, we had never been to anything Pentecostal. And, as an eleven-year-old boy, all I knew about this tent meeting was what I'd been told: my mother said, "When you get prayed for, you are going to be healed." My grandmother said, "When you get prayed for, you are going to be healed." Even our Baptist pastor said, "When that man prays for you, you'll be healed."

Oral Roberts was holding his tent meeting at the Lakewood Fairgrounds in Atlanta. On the second night of the meeting, I went up to receive prayer. When Brother Roberts laid his hands on me and prayed, it felt like I had stuck my finger in a

light socket. I felt a charge go through my entire body. When he was done praying for me, Brother Roberts sat back in his chair, threw his arms up and said, "You just got healed." I just looked at him, nodded, and said, "Yes, sir."

I went back to my seat, and my older brother came up to me and excitedly asked, "What happened to you?"

I said, "I got healed. Why?"

He said, "You jumped two feet off the platform! You went straight up in the air!"

People have asked me, "How did you know you were healed?" The answer is simple—I knew that God had healed me because I didn't hurt anymore.

The pain was gone, but my mother still took me back to the doctor. We went back to the specialist who had been treating me and he ran test after test. See, this doctor knew that I only had 25 percent hearing in one ear and 35 percent in the other. He knew that I had holes in both eardrums. Finally, after what seemed like two hours of testing, he took us into his office. He sat down behind his big desk and said, "I don't understand it. His hearing has over tripled what it's ever been, and I find no trace of the infection whatsoever." Then my mother sat there and explained to the doctor what we had done. She told him about James 5:14-15. She told him about going to Oral Roberts. She told him about the prayer of faith. After listening to all of it, the doctor said, "It had to have been God because I couldn't do it." Then he added, "Just bring him back in six months for a check-up." That was in 1966. I have not had a headache since.

There is no question in my mind that God heals—no question whatsoever. He can heal an eleven-year-old boy who doesn't know anything about healing. And if God can heal a boy whose family doesn't know anything about healing, then He can heal anyone. It's not a big deal for Him.

But when it comes to believing for healing, some people take an all-or-nothing approach. They'll say, "Well, I'm believing God," and then cut everything else out. No, we do the best that we can, and we allow God. In my case, we went to the doctor and followed the treatment. Medicine sometimes can't heal you, but medicine can help, and it can give God time to complete the healing in His time. 🥒



The Truth of the Gospel

WHEN YOU STUDY Paul's epistles, you will see four things that can be found:

- Paul establishing doctrine.
- 2. Paul confirming doctrine that has been already established.
- 3. Paul refuting false doctrine.
- 4. Paul giving instruction regarding the believer's behavior.

In the book of Galatians, we find Paul confirming the doctrine of justification by faith, and he refutes the false doctrine of the Judaizers regarding the mixing of law and grace.


The purpose of the Galatians epistle is as follows: the Galatian believers, who were gentiles, had been won to the Lord through the preaching of Paul and were greatly devoted to him. However, Jewish emissaries from Jerusalem had come into their midst and began to lead them away from the simple truth of grace and faith by attacking Paul's apostleship and teaching them that salvation could only be obtained by the observance of the

rites of the Jewish religion—namely the rite of circumcision for gentile males. They taught that the law of Moses was binding and necessary for salvation. Simply put, they were mixing law and grace. They were also trying to deny the apostleship of Paul, for if they could turn the Galatians against Paul, then they could easily be seduced into error.

In the text, Paul is relating to these gentiles his confrontation with Peter in a meeting in Antioch Syria. While the confrontation in Antioch was over dietary laws, still, the argument was the same—the adding of religious laws to grace and faith.

In Galatians 2:14, Paul used the term, "the truth of the gospel." What did he mean? The term implies all that the gospel embodies with special emphasis on the doctrine of justification by faith.

Paul was stating that by adding the law of Moses to grace and faith, one was, in fact, nullifying the great gospel of grace and justification by faith.

For clarity, let's define justification. In his book Knowing the Doctrines of the Bible, Myer Pearlman, defines justification as "an act of God's free grace wherein He pardeneth all our sins and accepteth us as righteous in His sight."

To go deeper, justification is a divine act of God that upon the faith of the believing sinner, God declares us first, not guilty; second, innocent; and third, perfect, as though we had never sinned a day in our lives. Now, one may wonder, "How can this be? I know I'm not perfect." The answer is, at that moment, in the mind of God, we are placed into Christ, whereby He freely imputes to us

His perfect righteousness. Therefore, I am not judged by God according to my performance, but I am judged according to the performance of God's Son, and His performance is perfect. I am righteous because I have been granted the righteousness of Jesus Christ. And righteousness simply means "rightness"the state of being right with God and only by faith.

Now back to the Galatians. The deception of the Judaizers was an all-out attack on the grace of God and the expression of faith on our part. When one tries to add any other requirements for salvation, i.e., circumcision, dietary laws, water baptisms, church membership, or anything else, you are denying the truth of the gospel. Salvation is by Christ and Christ alone.

The law of Moses was perfect in that it was given by God. It wasn't given to save but to show man how utterly lost he was and how incapable he was to save himself. Galatians 3:24 says, "Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ that, we might be justified by faith. But after that faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster."

Let us hold fast the truth of the gospel. We are justified by faith and not works.

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

In God We Trust

WHEN WE THINK of the word trust. what do we think of? Are there any individuals whom you could say that you trust completely? Are there any beliefs that you trust without wavering? If so, who are those individuals and what are those beliefs? The next question that I want to pose is this: Have those individuals or beliefs let you down at any time in your life? Inevitably, the ones you trust in are going to let you down, and those beliefs that you hold dear will fail you. But there is one exception—one person who will never let you down—and that person is God. Let's take a closer look at this psalm that was written by David. This was a cry of distress on the part of David, and in this psalm, we see a trend that we as believers need to take to heart

CONFIDENCE OR ASSURANCE

The first thing that stands out is David's trust in the Lord. In fact, the word trust really means "to be confident or sure." It is a confidence or an assurance that no

matter what happens, God will bring him through. This is something that we as Christians need to fully grasp—we should have the assurance and confidence that no matter what happens to us in life, our God will bring us through each trial and tribulation. In fact, no other person can fully say that he has this type of assurance, other than the true Christian. The reason David had this confidence is through experience. He had experienced the Lord delivering him from troubles in the past, and he was confident that this time would be no different. Can you say the same thing today? Do you have that assurance or confidence that God will lead you through vour situation? Understand that God has a proven track record, and as David could say this, many Christians should say this as well.

YOU WILL NOT BE DISAPPOINTED

Second, with this assurance or confidence in God, you will not be ashamed.

That word ashamed means to be disappointed and carries the idea of disappointment that God failed to come through as He said He would. No one can ever say that God failed to come through because He has, and always will, come through. It just may not be when you want it. We must understand that God doesn't operate according to our whims and fancies; He operates in His own timing, and His timing is just as important as His will. He has a time for everything, and when He decides that it's time for Him to act on our behalf, He will. He's an on-time God—He may not come when we want Him to-but He will be there right on time. He has never been late, nor has He ever been too early. At times we feel He may be late, but He is never late. Believer, understand that God is constantly working behind the spiritual scenes putting things in place for your ultimate blessing. And when He comes through, you will not be ashamed or disappointed.

YOUR ENEMIES WILL NOT STAND OVER YOU

Third, when your trust is anchored in the Lord and His finished work, your enemies will not triumph over you. In other words, it is not God's will for you to live a life of constant defeat. It's not God's will for the giants in your life to stand over you. It's not God's will for sin to reign and rule in your life. However, it is God's will for you to live a life of victory with you standing over the giants in your life. It all goes back to knowing who you are in Christ and believing that His completed work was enough. Paul would say "Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us, which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross; And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a shew of them openly, triumphing over them in it" (Col. 2:14-15).

Since Christ is the ultimate victor, and He defeated every bondage of sin at the cross, Satan has no legal right to hold any child of God captive. And seeing that we are now in Christ, His victories have become our victories.

Paul said, "Nay, in all these things we are more that conquerors through Him that loved us" (Rom. 8:37). Because of Christ's accomplishments on the cross and our faith in that finished work, we are not just conquerors but more than conquerors through Christ. It was Christ who won the victory, and seeing that we are in Him, we can experience the benefits of His victory. John the Beloved wrote, "For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith" (I John 5:4). If we follow God's prescribed order of victory, we will be overcomers. He didn't say we might be overcomers—we will be!


THE KEY TO PROPER TRUST

The kev in all of this is to trust in what Christ has already provided. I can assure you, with your trust in Christ and the cross, you will experience an assurance that you will make it through, you will not be disappointed, and your enemies will not triumph over you. But all of this requires that your faith and trust be anchored in Christ and the cross. I ask this question: Is your trust in Christ or is it in something else? This requires a look deep into your heart and actually being honest with yourself. If you say that your faith has been in other things, then you will not have an assurance that you will make it through, and you will be disappointed every single time, with your enemies standing over you. There's still time to develop that trust by placing your faith in Christ and the cross, which means understanding and believing that everything you receive from God has been paid for by Christ through His completed work on the cross.

"Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging: and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise." -PROVERBS 20:1

Wine Is a Mocker, Strong **Drink Is Raging**

PART II



The first passage is John 2:1-12—the recorded story of Jesus Christ attending the wedding at Cana with his mother and where He performed his first miracle. When Christ and His disciples arrived at the wedding, his mother advised him that they were all out of wine. After a moment of discussion between Iesus and His mother. He instructs the servants to fill up the six water pots with water, and they "filled them up to the brim." Christ then instructed the servants to serve the contents of the water pots to the people and especially to the governor of the feast. Upon drinking of the new wine, the governor of the feast stated, "Every man at the beginning doth set forth good

wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but you have kept the good wine until now."


Why was the second serving of wine better than the first serving? I believe Christ prayed a prayer that is not recorded in Scripture where He asked His Father to turn the Galilean water into wine. I believe the last serving of wine was not fermented but rather heavenly wine made supernaturally by the Holy Spirit to manifest the glory and divinity of Christ. So the attendees and the governor of the feast did not drink oinos (fermented wine) at the second serving, but because of a supernatural miracle from God, they were all drinking heavenly wine produced by the Spirit of God. The new wine in this story was not fermented wine but wine straight from heaven. No Christian should ever use this Scripture to justify their desire to drink wine or

strong drink. If you do, you are twisting Scripture to satisfy the lusts of the flesh.

The second controversial verse is I Timothy 5:23: "Drink no longer water, but use a little wine for thy stomach's sake and thine often infirmities." Some believers use this Scripture to support their strong desire to drink wine. The Greek word for infirmities is astheneia, and it clearly shows that the apostle Paul is concerned about a real disease or sickness in Timothy's body. In II Timothy 4:11, the Bible states that Luke, Paul's

physician, is with Paul in Rome when he writes these words. I believe that with the wise counsel of Luke, Paul admonishes Timothy to drink wine—the Greek word here is oinos, meaning fermented wine—with the belief that a little wine would rid the stomach of some gastrointestinal issues that were causing weakness and sickness and would aid in the healing process. Some medical doctors have reported that red wine and red grapes might improve gut microbiota working as a digestive probiotic and

activating certain enzymes to bring healing to the gastrointestinal part of the body. I believe that Timothy had

a serious physical ailment associated with his stomach and that the apostle Paul, advised by Luke, felt that a little wine might help the digestive probiotics process and from this would come healing and strength. Paul stipulates a little wine for a stomach problem. He is not encouraging social drinking.

So I Timothy 5:23 should not be used to justify or explain one's willingness to drink wine or strong drink. If it is to be used, it would be used under the orders of a doctor as medicine, not for recreational purposes.

> We read and hear about some believers, and even ministers, who are letting down the standard of our conservative Pentecostal

faith, and they are espousing that it is acceptable for Christians to drink wine and alcohol socially, as long as it is just one or two drinks at a time. Basically, they are embracing or encouraging recreational social drinking. Some believers are teaching that it is ok to get buzzed or a little tipsy but not smashed. If a truly born-again believer will read these Scriptures and ask for the Holy Spirit to reveal to him the truth concerning the drinking of wine and alcohol, then I believe that he will be strongly convicted by the Holy Spirit to not ever get involved in the drinking of wine, beer, vodka, or alcohol

of any kind. I urge you, bring this issue to God in prayer and see what the Holy Spirit says to you.

Here are some facts to consider:

- A person is considered legally drunk in the United States if his blood alcohol concentration is 0.8 and above. This level can get you arrested for driving under the influence (DUI) if you drink and
- A hundred-pound person can be legally drunk after two 12-ounce bottles of beer.
- A person of 200 pounds can be legally drunk after four 12-ounce bottles of beer.

The apostle Paul wrote in Colossians 2:21, "Touch not; taste not; and handle not." I believe that this command applies to the drinking of wine, beer, and all other alcoholic beverages.

Dear reader, if you partake of alcohol, wine, vodka, or any form of strong drink, then I urge you to turn to God in prayer and sincerely repent. It is wrong, and it will lead to a life of shame, bad health, and regret. Please, turn to God, repent of this sin, and ask God to deliver you from the desire of wine and alcohol. As the great Holy Spirit helped my father years ago, He is ready to help you, and set you free. Dad always clarified, "You have got to hate your sin." Ask God to cause you to hate the taste of alcohol and wine. By truly repenting and centering your faith totally on the cross and what Jesus did for you there, you can be delivered, saved, and set free to the glory of God and stay free from alcohol and wine.

Progressing in Christ PART II

PROGRESSING IN CHRIST

To progress means to advance or develop a more full and complete understanding of the provision(s) given. Last month we focused on progressing in the truth of justification. This month we will focus on the doctrine of sanctification. This will involve the definition of sanctification. the believer's role in sanctification, and the progress the believer should make in applying sanctification to the growth process.

UNDERSTANDING SANCTIFICATION

The simple definition of sanctification is "to be set apart for God." This occurs at salvation. The believer becomes a trophy of God's grace and is set aside for His purpose and use. However, it is spurious to think that God would set aside a vessel that is still dominated by the powers of sin. Through the believer's union with Christ, the power of sin is broken. Sin's presence is not eradicated, but it's dominion over the believer is dealt a death blow. The believer is to understand that he has

become dead to sin and alive to God (Rom. 6:11). Every agent of sin will find itself neutralized by the miracle of the new birth and the entrance of the Holy Spirit. This would include the corrupting power of the sin nature, the draw of the world's system, the meddling of the powers of darkness, and all that is included in regard to the flesh. Progressing in sanctification does not mean that we progressively defeat sin or its agents. It means that the believer advances and develops a more complete understanding of the provision of sanctification and learns to apply it. Freedom from the dominion of sin does not exempt believers from the presence of sin. But faith in Christ and His finished work will maintain victory over all sin, despite its constant presence.

THE BELIEVER'S ROLE IN SANCTIFICATION

The believer's role in sanctification involves the responsibility to maintain the right object of faith. By this statement we mean that it is the believer's

responsibility to ever keep his spiritual eyes and regenerated heart focused and trusting in what Christ accomplished for humanity at Calvary. The believer's union with Christ brings about the neutralization of all the ever-present agents of sin. The sin nature, which serves as the corrupting agent of man's heart and mind, has been rendered idle and ineffective. The pull of the world's system on the heart of the believer has been "crucified," and it is our faith in this truth that helps us overcome the world. The principalities and powers of darkness were "spoiled" through the event of the cross. According to I Peter 5:8-9, the believer now applies this knowledge of Satan's defeat by faith and thereby neutralizes supernatural powers that attempt to "devour" him. The sin nature has corrupted the flesh, placing within the heart and mind of man improper desires and thoughts. According to Galatians 5:24, we find that our union with Christ has already crucified the flesh (the effects of the sin nature's work in the individual) with its

affections and lusts. Galatians 5:16 says that if we walk in the Spirit (maintain the right object of faith), even though we will encounter these affections and lusts, we will not practice or fulfill them. The challenge to sanctification is the need to believe that what Iesus did for us at Calvary makes living free from sin and all its agents not only a possibility but also a responsibility and a welcome reality.

PROGRESSING IN SANCTIFICATION

According to Ephesians 2:8-9 the Bible teaches that the believer is saved by grace through faith. When faith is properly placed in Christ, the grace of God can flow unhindered to benefit the believer. In sanctification, the grace of God is carried out by the person of the Holy Spirit who equips the believer to live

righteously. The term saved means to be healed, protected, delivered, or made whole. To progress in sanctification, the believer has to operate by faith in the finished work of Christ, which results in the help of the Holy Spirit. To be assured that indwelling sin or the sin nature remains idle and ineffective, the believer maintains this same object of faith. If the believer changes his or her object of faith, then the sin nature has the potential to revive and once again corrupt the inner man. To progress in freedom from the sin nature, the believer need only maintain the proper object of faith. At times in our journey, things of this world and things that are maintained in the world system can call out to us to participate.

To deny that there is never any attraction to the world would not be honest. But if the believer maintains proper faith and grace is constantly flowing, the world's call will go unanswered. Satan walks about as a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour. The believer who is progressing in sanctification knows that these spiritual entities are neutralized through the believer containing a proper object of faith. At times, there may be an influence that attempts to impact the heart and then take expression through the body. The believer is to understand that these affections and lusts are improper. We do not apply willpower to overcome lusts and affections. To walk in freedom, our faith must remain singularly, exclusively, and pointedly in Christ and the cross. Then grace will flow, and the believer will find himself living free from all negative aspects of the flesh.



To progress in Christ demands that we understand justification. We embrace it not to live in sin but to find the ability to rise again after each and every failure. We progress in sanctification as we operate in the right object of faith and overcome the agents of sin and the presence of sin through properly placed faith. Progressing in Christ depends upon consistently placing our faith in what God has provided for us in Christ as we maintain an attitude of humility and dependence.

PROGRESSIVISM—The American dream that once consisted of a broadening middle-class supported by a strong nuclear family and civic lawfulness has long been usurped by an elite cabal of thinkers that saw America, and the world, through a different lens.



Cultural Revolution

THEIR GENERATIONAL EFFORTS are to transform society into their image—a secular society run by conceited miscreants who redefine laws that oppose biblical principles. In order to succeed with their diabolical plan, they had to create a means for the gradual transition from Judeo-Christian values to secular humanism. They set out to formulate the belief that the entire world and all of man's social behaviors can be analyzed through the lens of objective science. They insisted their scientific observations reveal that religion, especially Christianity, represses man's true nature.

An early example of this is a wealthy Quaker by the name of Johns Hopkins who passed away and left a large sum of money for the founding of a hospital and university. This university was to be unlike any other in the United States—Harvard was

founded to train Unitarian and Congregational clergy; Yale was founded to teach religious languages; Dartmouth was founded to teach Christianity to American Indians; and Princeton was founded to serve as a seminary for Presbyterian ministers—but Johns Hopkins was founded not only to teach but to discover as well. It sought to create or uncover new knowledge. Its first president, Daniel Coit Gilman, declared its mission, "To educate its students and to cultivate their capacity for lifelong learning." As a new model for American research, Johns Hopkins became the institution designed to produce new knowledge with progress as its defining value.

SCIENCE OF THE MIND Their new realm of scientific persuasion was developed to view the science of man to mimic natural sciences. For example, philosopher David Hume conceived himself as the Newton of the mind. Meanwhile, Saint-Simone and Friedrich Hegel both professed to discover the science of history. The idea that human affairs were merely extensions of physical sciences was later called scientism by political strategist and economist Friedrich Hayek.

Richard Ely was hired by Johns Hopkins in 1881 as a professor and director of its Department of Political Economy. Although Ely earned his bachelor's degree at Columbia University, he took his Ph.D. at Heidelberg in Germany. On his return to the United States, Ely established himself to become one of the most prominent and influential advocates of the social gospel, which posited that the state can and should be harnessed to fix the problems of society. He believed the state had a responsibility to fix the societal problems of poverty, crime, racial injustice, child labor, and many other ills that affect society. He saw the practical side of Christianity as a priority believing that God works through the state to carry out His purposes more universally than through any other institution. Ely would further establish himself as one of the leading voices of the new progressivism. He became an important figure in the transformation of the American state and socio-political mindset. He saw the state as the natural and necessary administrator. Prior to this mindset, Christianity advocated for voluntary community efforts produced by good works and philanthropy.

WOODROW WILSON As a doctoral student at Johns Hopkins, Woodrow Wilson came under the influence of Richard Ely and embraced his teachings as a faithful disciple. Wilson would absorb Ely's understanding of political economy and his belief in the scientific nature of their undertaking. Wilson was elected to the Board of the American Economics Association (AEA), an organization that supported Ely's vision. The AEA philosophy regarded the state as an educational and ethical agency whose positive aid is an indispensable condition of human progress. They believed that the conflict of labor and capital fostered a vast number of social problems wherein solutions are impossible without the united efforts of church, state, and science. The unification of faith, government, and scientistic methodologies would become the heart and the soul of the American Left for decades to come. Wilson would become the acolyte behind Ely's ideals and bring them into reality. To help accomplish the task, he would employ the idea that politics and administration should be separate with experts handling the day-to-day chores of governance. The second step was to attack the Constitution and its relevance with the authority of his office to inflict the real damage to the constitutional order, overseeing the creation of a new political and economic apparatus. The new apparatus would seek to dominate the administration of economic policy—still present today. Wilson advocated for a study to discover what the government can properly do and how it can do these proper things with efficiency and at the least possible cost of money and energy.

PROGRESS OF PROGRESSIVISM The concept of administration and politics was embraced by Frank Goodnow. Goodnow become the third president of Johns Hopkins in 1914. Goodnow rejected the merits of the American founding, arguing that the founder's obsession with "private rights" had helped make Americans a lawless people. The idea behind the American public management was that people are too ignorant and too selfish to vote for that which is in their best interests, or in the best interests of society as a whole. The original idea of Richard Ely and his disciples evolved, or should I say, progressed. Dwight Waldo would slightly depart from Ely's philosophy on the "scientific" manner. He believed it required the application of values. Waldo argued that public servants house become active, informed, politically savvy agents of change. He favored a political structure in which traditional participants—the voters and their elected representatives—were supplemented and even superseded by unelected and unaccountable experts. Moreover, these experts were encouraged to apply their values, in lieu of what the people valued, to create a better, more efficient, and more equitable society. Please keep in mind that it was during Wilson's stint as president of the United States that the Federal Reserve Bank was created. Wilson decided that he wanted his experts to run the Federal Reserve Bank. He created a large, powerful central institution; he also ensured that the powerful private interests would be willing to supplement the governments expertise by aligning their interests with the state's.

A NEW RELIGION The developing thoughts of the state satisfying the needs of society via the counsel of experts has permeated modern society. It affected our educational system, government, business, and family and religious components of society. Progressivism mixed itself with concepts of Marxism and socialism. Psychology became their therapeutic means to cope with the new changes. Traditional values were criticized as the fault for society's failures and its victims needing experts to solidify their victim-hood. Schools train and prepare their new society adherents to cooperate and advance the principles of change.

What are Satan's intentions toward the saint of God? How does he carry out his battle plan? We do not have to devote an inordinate amount of time studying Satan while neglecting the weightier matters of the Christian life. We know Satan's battle plans by simply knowing God's Word and being sensitive to His Holy Spirit.

THE MIND OF A CHRISTIAN

It is imperative for Christians to evaluate their thought life. Not every thought deserves a second thought. We live in a fallen world. Our minds are receptacles receiving images and concepts throughout the day. Seeds are planted through music, advertising, television, store displays, discussions we take part in, and things we read. Paul instructs us

to evaluate each and every thought and reject those that do not survive God's divine filter (Philippians 4:8). Paul tells us: "Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (II Cor. 10:5). Trials and temptations become less when believers bring every thought under the obedience of Christ.


VICTORY THROUGH CHRIST

James tells us to submit to God and resist the devil with the result that he will flee (4:7). The order is essential. The devil will not flee unless we are totally and scripturally submitted to God. There are too many Christians attempting to earn or attain their freedom through self-effort. Not surprisingly, they continually experience failure.

Submission to God begins and continues with accepting the completed work of Calvary as the only source of victory. Religious acts, although feeding one's ego, have no authority. I love what Charles Spurgeon said in reference to man's attempt to save himself: "The greatest enemy to the human soul is the self-righteous spirit which makes men look to themselves for salvation."1 The cross of Christ and the Christ of the cross is our only victory against the enemy of our soul. Don't look to yourself for victory. Look to Christ.

It is very common in the game of basketball when the head coach calls a play out to his team that you hear him shout, "Iso, iso!" It's short for isolation. In doing so, the coach is usually wanting to get his best player the ball to make a play and score either the winning shot, or a much-needed one. The coach knows this: his star player will not be able to do what is needed unless he is singled out and given the ball.

When You're Left Alone

IN LIFE, IT'S difficult for people to undergo isolation. For many it's the fear of being singled out. For others isolation, in general, can be a lonely place. In the business world, people have to make decisions as to whether they will strike out on their own, or take comfort in working for a company where the risk of losing money, time, or hard work is shifted onto the owner.

But it seems that more people than not prefer to be part of a team where they can blend in undetected. Last summer, I was preaching in Trenton, Kentucky, at an Assembly of God church (the pastor there was part of the first graduating class of Jimmy Swaggart Bible College in the early 1980s). A lady, much my senior, walked through the door, and we greeted one another. As we spoke, she informed me that she was blessed by my singing and watched the network almost every day. Then she quickly and unmistakably informed me that we had a few differences on the topic of the Holy Spirit. She said, "We don't believe in speaking in

other tongues as you all do." Now, I found this very interesting. In her description, she used the word we. Not "I" but "we," speaking of her home church.

You see, it's easy, and we find it more comfortable to talk about what "we" believe. I did that myself as a young man growing up in Family Worship Center. Believe you me, I had every reason to talk about what "my church" believed, or what "my pastors" believed. My father, Loren Larson, had spent almost every morning with Brother Swaggart on radio. And he was actually there in the "broom-andmop closet" (it was a pretty small recording room) on the day that God spoke to Brother Swaggart's heart an answer to almost a decade's worth of seeking God in prayer: "The Holy Spirit only works within the parameters of the finished work of Christ." I had heard some version of this truth almost every Sunday since I was old enough to remember. Yet, what is true of most was also true about me: we find strength in numbers. We can rest our case, we suppose, when others

share our opinion. But the Lord had to eventually isolate me from the group and ask me on a personal level, "Joseph, I don't want to know what the group you are part of believes. What do you believe, and why do you believe it?"

Notice that Paul was concerned for the church in Corinth over the same issue. No one preached the message of the cross more than Paul. But even in his own churches, this issue became magnified. Many were associating themselves with the group they were a part of more

than the message that Paul preached: "I am of Paul; and another, I am of Apollos." God knows that we are only as strong as we can survive under pressure alone. That's why Peter said, "Though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations: That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ." (I Pet. 1:6-7).

God does a work in our lives on an

individual level before He moves in the corporate realm. Look at every man or woman whom God ever called, and you'll find that a pattern of isolation came before empowerment—John the Baptist, Elijah and Elisha, David, Peter. Even Christ to some extent was isolated before His ministry began. If God hasn't done it yet, then He will bring about the same reality of isolation in your own experience. But remember what Peter said: It is simply God allowing trials to purify our faith. And that can't be done until the Holy Spirit calls out the play, "Iso, iso!" When you recognize that you have been given the ball, so to speak, you need to remember that God is simply giving you an opportunity to learn and grow. And don't get it wrong—God's not asking you to go one-on-one with Satan. In many cases, like with Jacob in the Old Testament, we are left alone to wrestle with God Himself. The battle in isolation is not so much our victories over our enemies. but God's victory over us. Here are some truths about isolation that we learn from Jacob's experience:

- 1. It took some time before Jacob realized that he was actually fighting God.
- 2. God showed Jacob the weakness of his own flesh.
- 3. Jacob's faith was not diminished by the trial: "I will not let thee go, except thou bless me."
- 4. Jacob had an opportunity to admit who he really was: "What is thy name?"
- 5. Jacob was given a new name, which means "Prince with God."

SEVERAL WEEKS AGO

in our Saturday morning prayer meeting, the Lord spoke something to my heart that I think would be of great interest to you, at least as it regards its significance.
